I. God's Promise will be fulfilled regardless of human attempts to control

A. This story is full of the sin of control and manipulation, but Jacob still ends up with the blessing.

Isaac sinned
Genesis 25:23; Genesis 25:28

Esau sinned
Hebrews 12:16-17

Rebekah and Jacob sinned

B. God has chosen him for two reasons:

To show an example of undeserved mercy and blessing
Ephesians 2:4-5; Titus 3:5-6

To remind us God is the only one in control
Romans 9:10-16; Psalm 115:3; Psalm 75:6-7; Romans 12:2

III. How do I trust in God and not my own control?

- A. Have confidence that God is good and that His plans are good.

RESPONSE TO THE MESSAGE

Open the envelope and read slowly of the blessings and promises that God gives you. Take in the depth and meaning of each phrase. Pray over any doubts you have that these blessings are for you.
